DESCRIPTION

This course has been developed to cater for all persons that are required to work at any height where there is a potential to fall and cause injury, fall from one level to another, work in elevated work platforms, work from scaffold, are required to be compliant with local legislation/Australian Standard AS/ NZS: 1891.

PREREQUISITES

Medically fit & Comfortable Working At Heights.
All participants are required to own bring Safety Boots, Gloves & Hard Hat.

DURATION

7 Hours classroom training and assessment.

ASSESMENT METHOD

Continuous assessment throughout the course, written and practical assessment of essential skills. Group practical .

- + The relevant statutory and regulatory authority requirements
- + The names and functions of equipment, components and materials
- + Hazard identification, risk assessment and control
- + Safe shifting and handling of tools and materials.
- + The nature of work undertaken at heights.
- + The processes of providing for safe work practices & safe work methods
- + Safety considerations to facilitate working safely at heights
- + Access, interpret and apply technical and safety information
- + Comply with environmental requirements, ie powerlines
- + Pendulum effect, snagging, effects of free fall and suspension trauma
